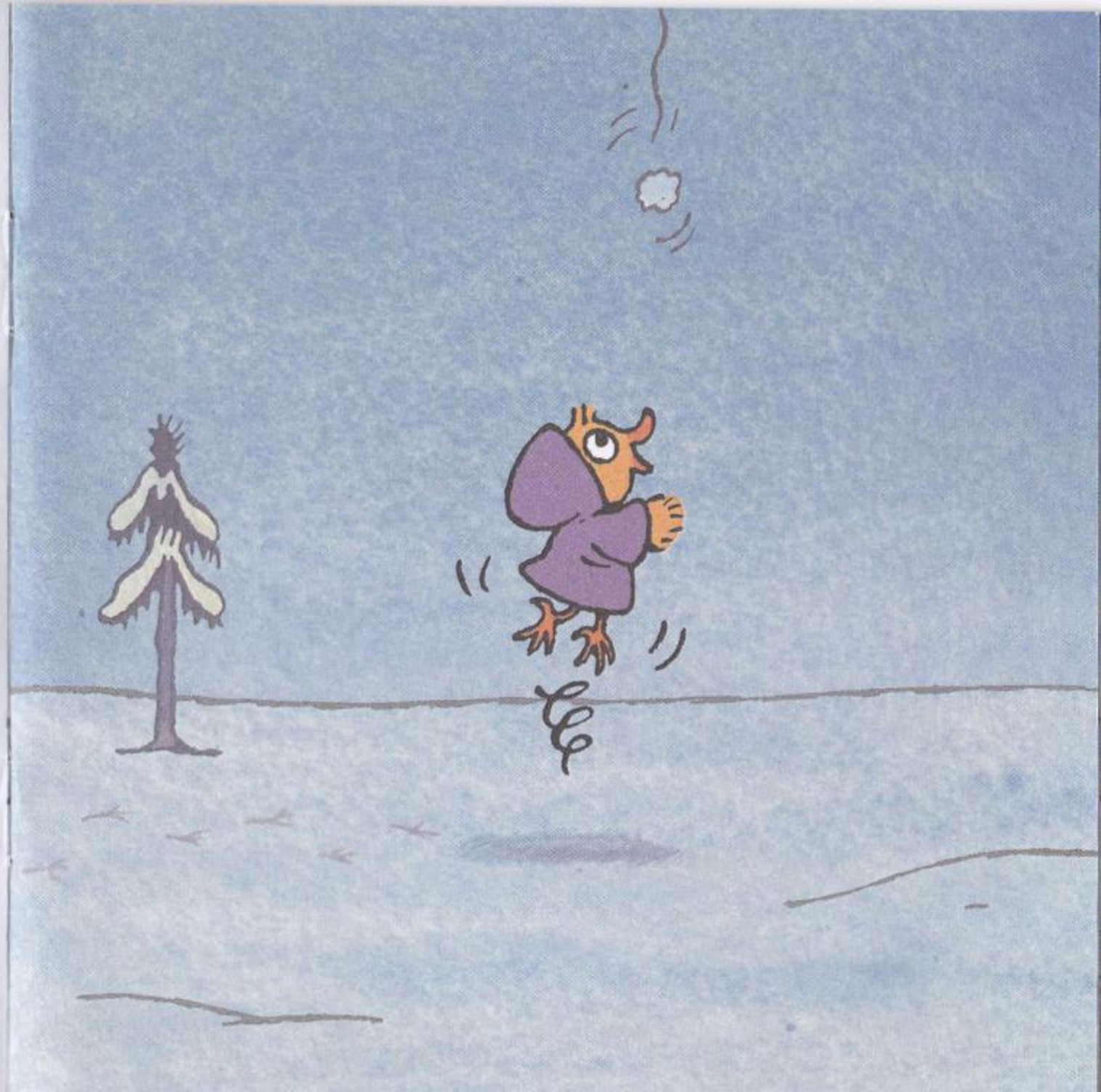

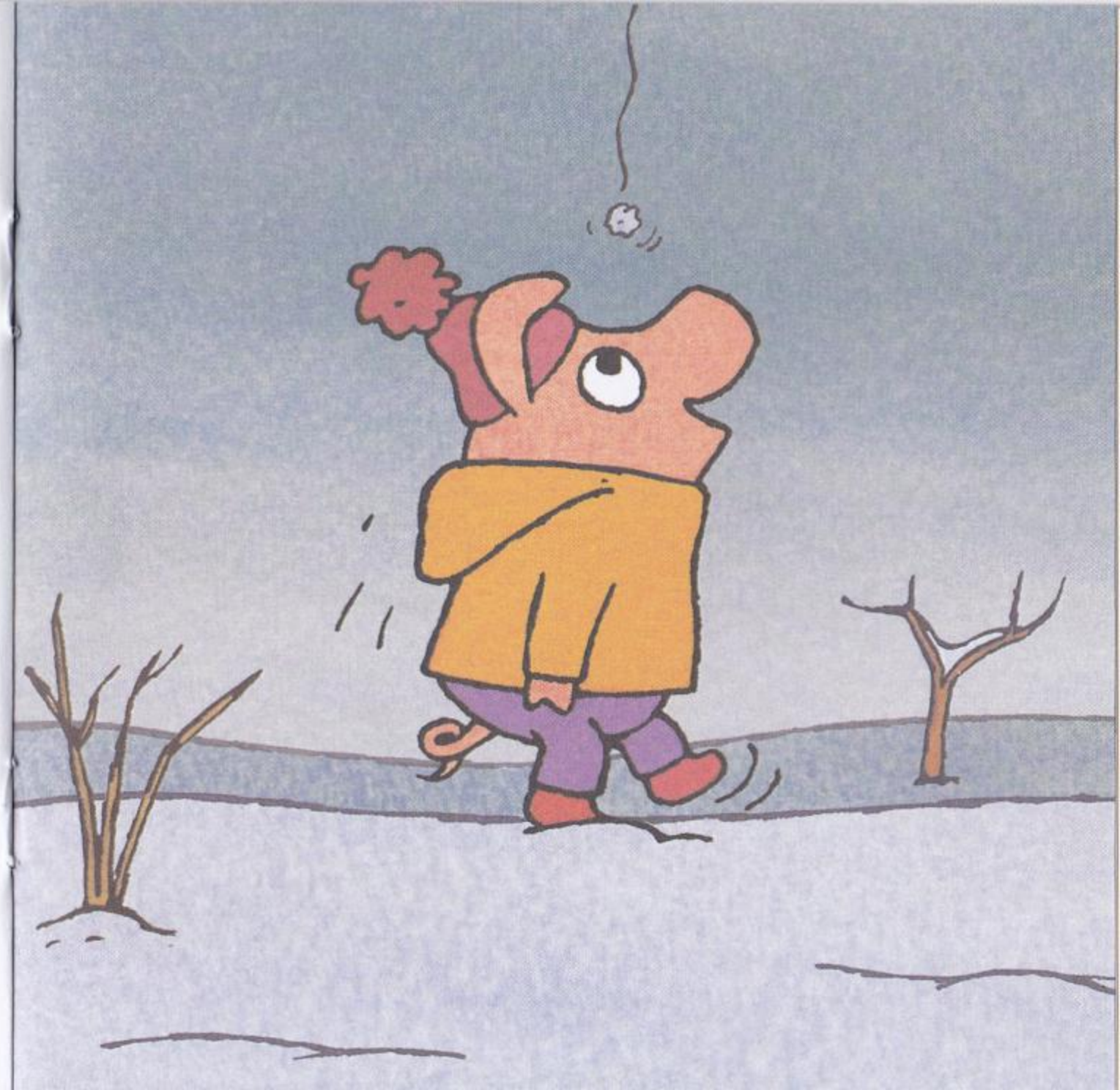

Rereading the Book Together

Take turns rereading each page. Why do the animals think it's snowing? How many animals spot a snowflake?

Fun with Words

Point out that *snowflake* is a compound word: *snow* and *flake*. What other compound words can you and your child list? Ideas include *postcard*, *skyscraper*, and *mailbox*.

More Learning
