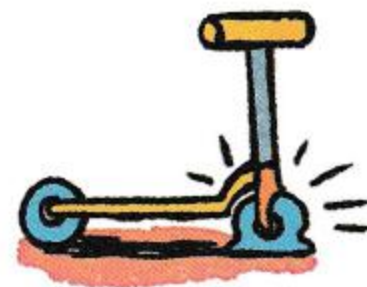

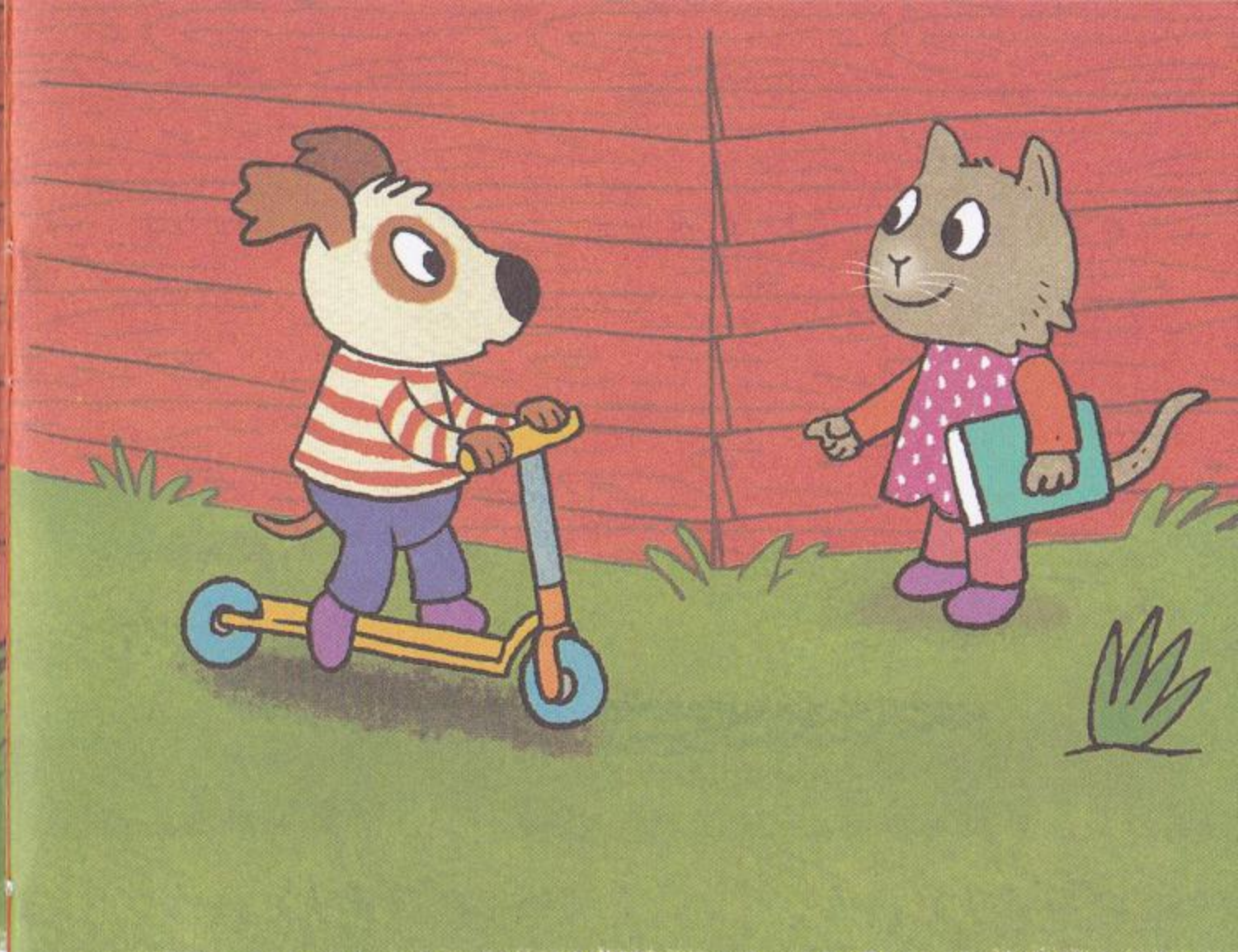

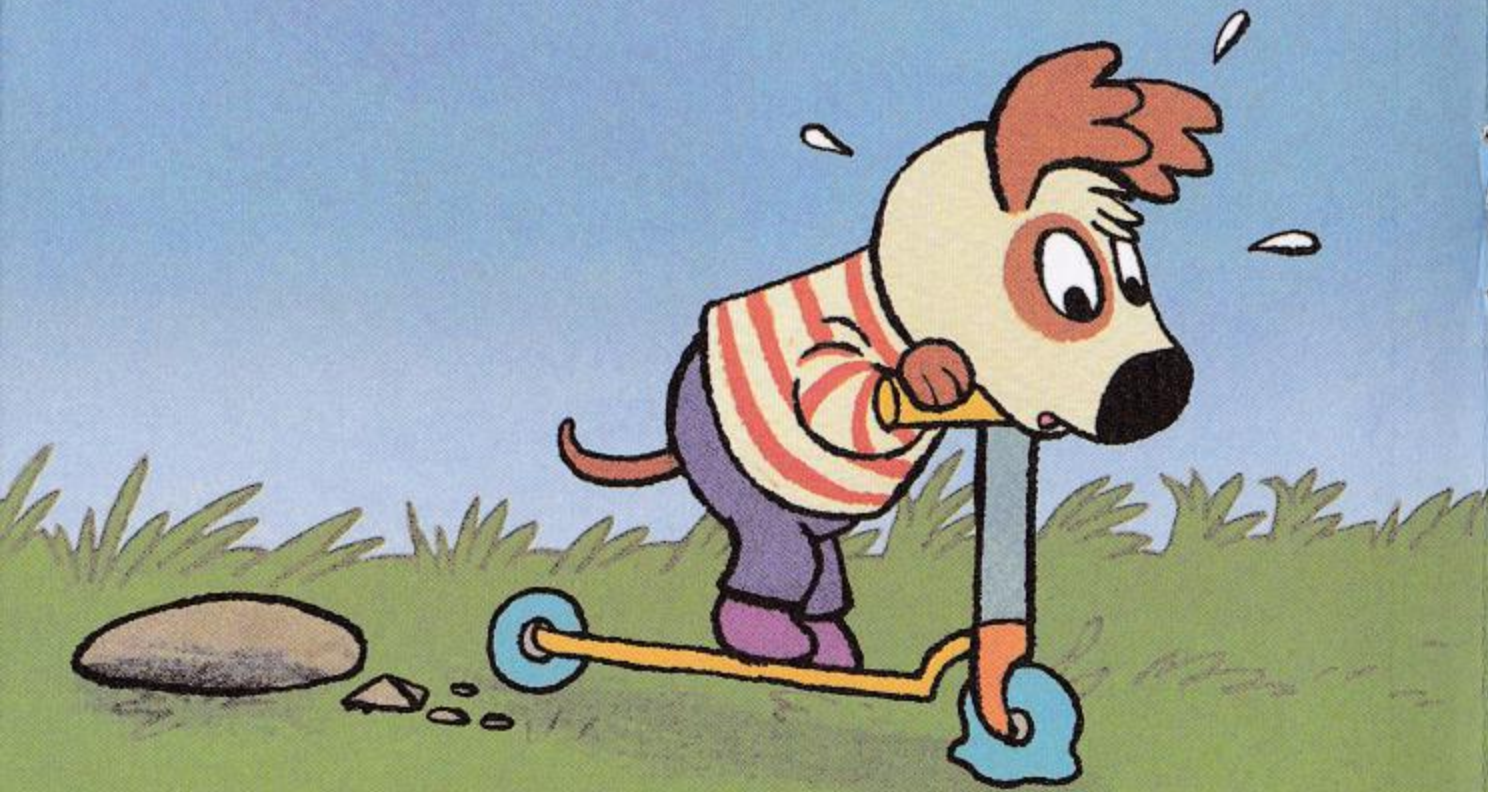
“May I have a turn?”
asks Nat the Cat.



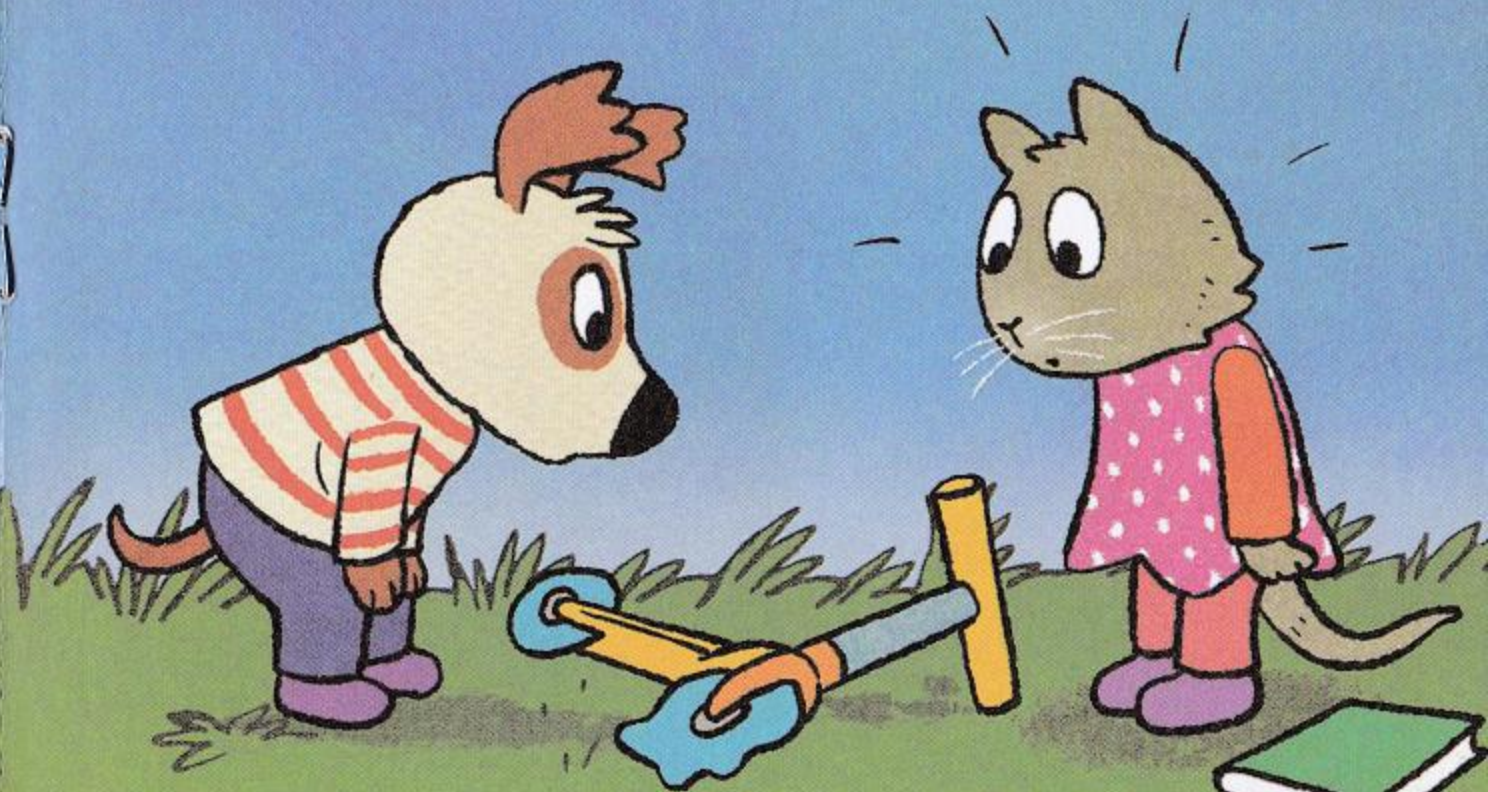
“No,” says Tug the Pup.

a fancy trick.



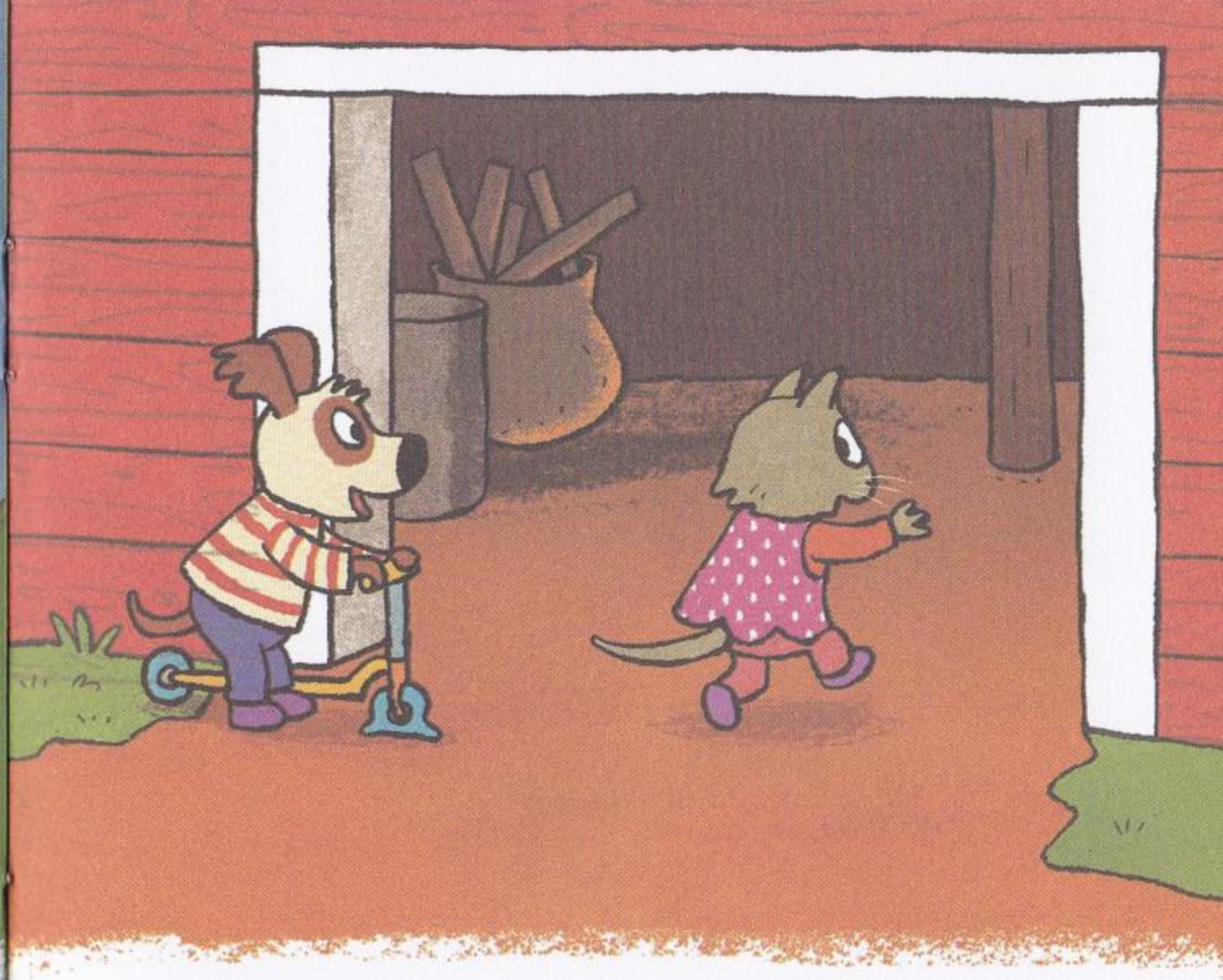
“Oh! My scooter has a flat tire,” says Tug the Pup.
