Children are naturally curious about the world around them, and curiosity is a powerful motivation for reading—and for success in school. Studies show that by understanding relationships among words, children quickly acquire new and interesting vocabulary. And the more they are able to talk about the world around them, the more they want to learn!

As you read with your child, be sure to point out the vocabulary tree.

Discuss the categories of words and how they relate to one another.

Then, explore the text together. Encourage your child to point out each of the vocabulary words as they appear in the text. You'll be surprised how fast your early reader identifies content-rich vocabulary.


Some beaches have white sand.

Some beaches are rocky.









Some beaches are smooth.







Some beaches have small crabs.







The beach keeps changing.
The tide can be high.




Or it can be low.

When it's low tide, there is less water.












In a tide pool, you can see sea stars
