DEAR PARENT,

Our world is filled with letters—those magical squiggles on the page that stand for sounds. Unlocking the mystery of these squiggles will help get your child on the right track to reading success.

One way to lay the foundation for that success is to read with your child every day. Step into Reading Phonics Readers offer a way to make the most of that experience. These books are designed to help your child learn the sounds that letters stand for, how letters come together to make words, and how words can be put together to make sentences. Engaging illustrations help children make the connection between words and pictures.

Tips for reading this book with your child:

Begin by reading this book aloud to your child. As you read, point to each word. This "tracking" will help your child make a connection between the written and spoken word.

Emphasize the sounds in rhyming words, such as cat and hat, or words that share a common consonant, such as sand and silly.
Read a word from the text and have your child find it. You can

give hints, such as "This word starts with the /s/ sound."

When your child feels comfortable with the story, have him or her read it to you. Praise your child's efforts and encourage rereading of the story.

Invite your child to find words from the story on signs or in other books. This will generate excitement about and interest in words.

Remember—all children deserve the gift of reading. As parents, you can help bestow that gift. It is one of the most important things you can do!
