Vocabulary

Neighborhoods in different areas may look different. Some neighborhoods have houses that are far apart and others close together.

Places in the Neighborhood



A **hospital** is a place where sick people are treated. You can go to a hospital when you are sick.



A **post office** is where you mail letters and packages.

Places in the Neighborhood



A **library** is a place where books and newspapers are kept. People can borrow books from **libraries**.



In Beijing, people like to sit, eat, and talk at a **restaurant**. It is a place where people eat food.

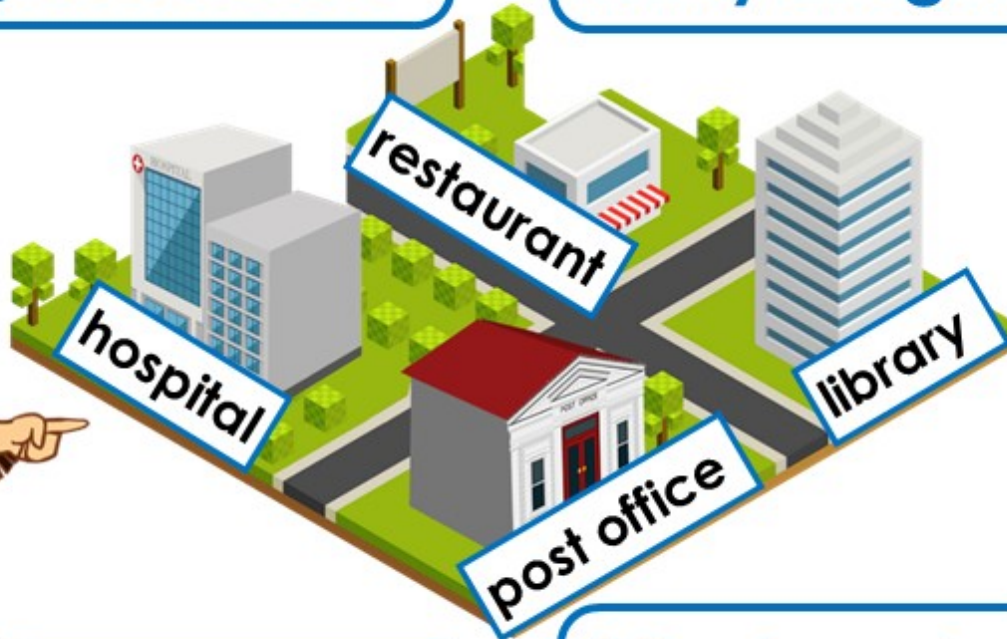

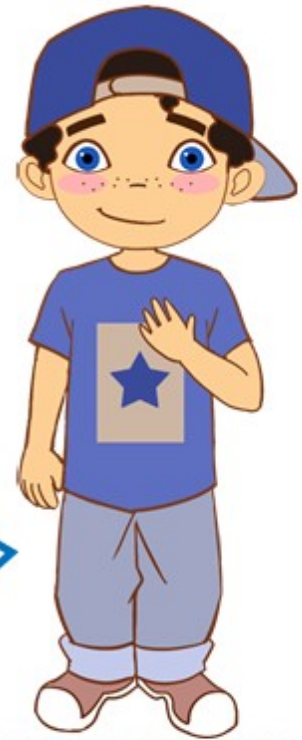

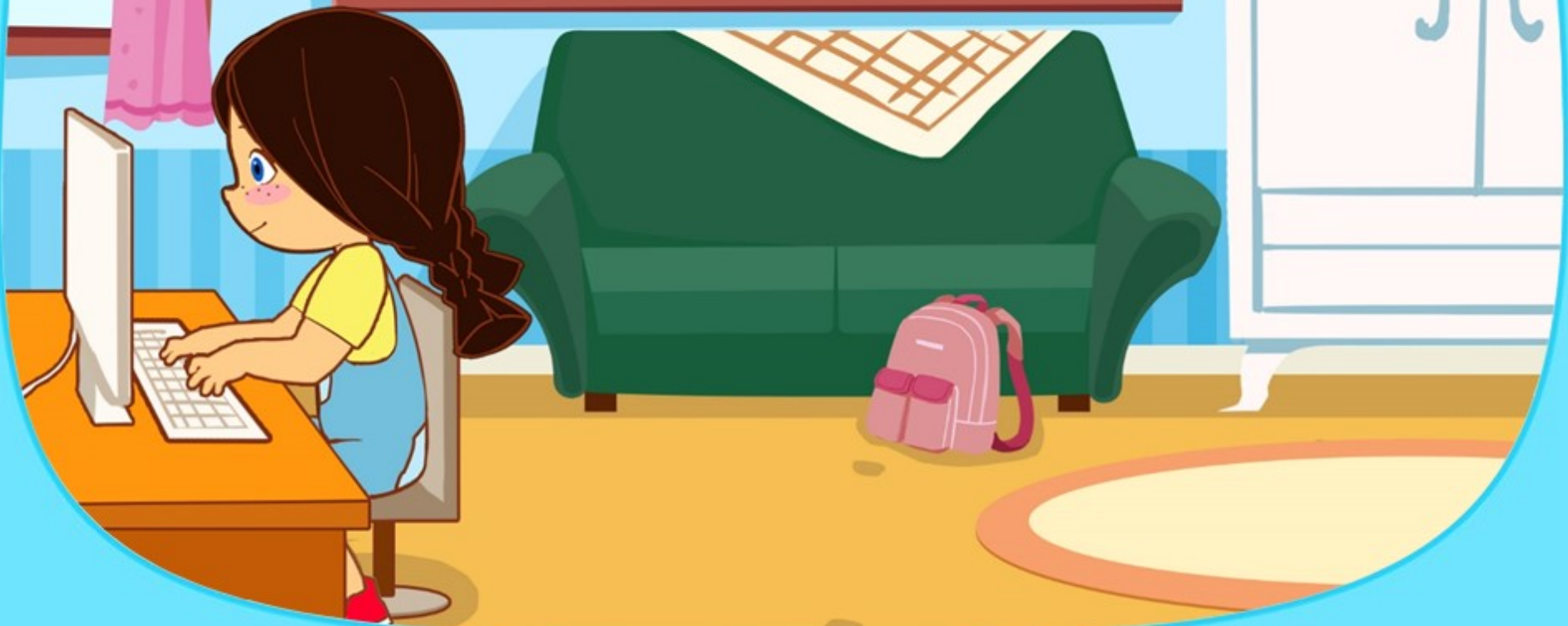
