Although I say come out and play

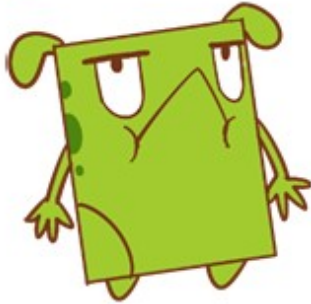
(motion finger for him to come)

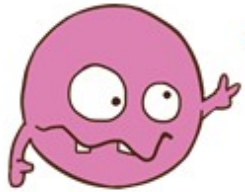


Bodies of Water

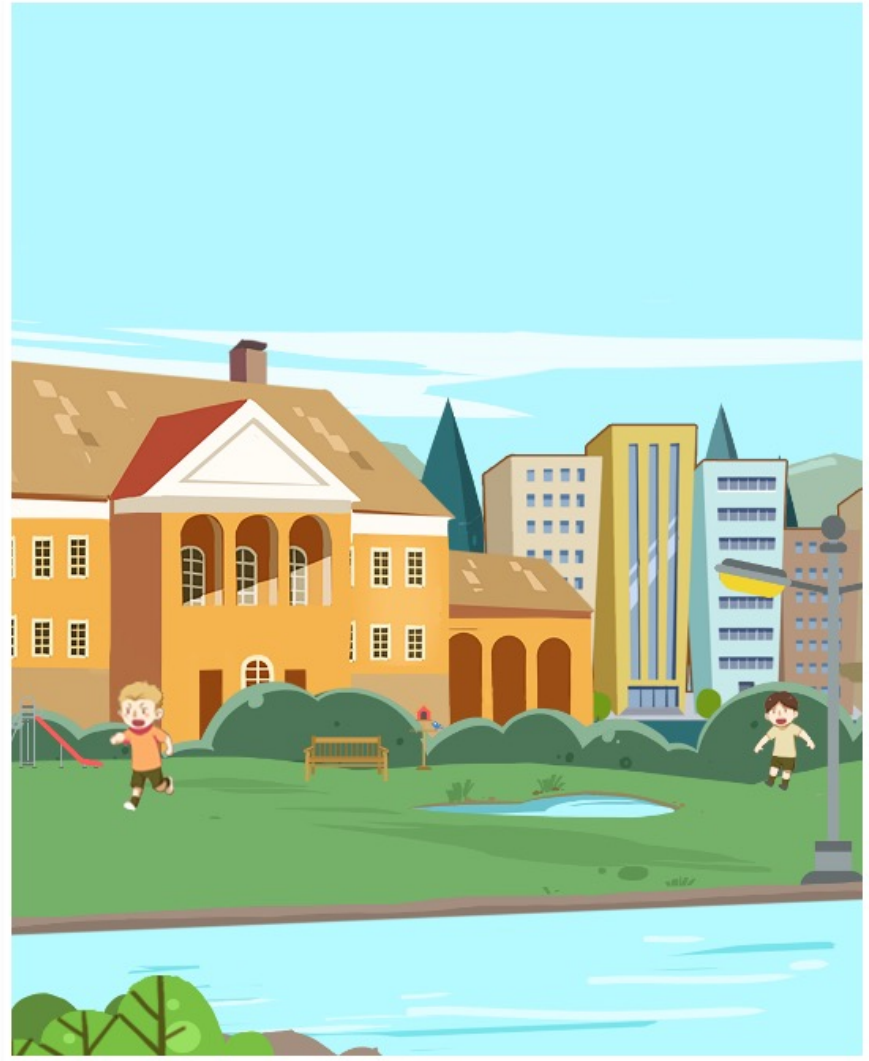
Different Pocket Parks

Different Pocket Parks

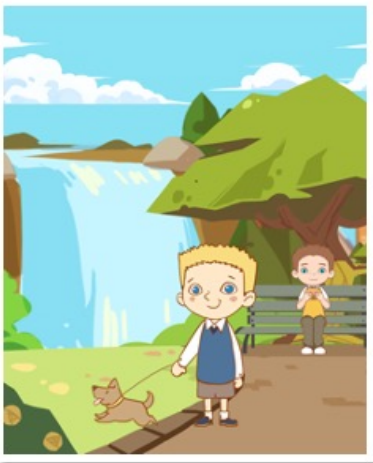


This is a tiny pocket park. It is behind trees. People can relax here and talk with their friends, or come and walk their dog. It is very relaxing to listen to the waterfall.
