



Many things live in ponds and lakes.








Ponds and lakes are usually filled with fresh water. This means that the water is not salty.

Ponds and lakes are home to many plants, fish, reptiles, and other animals. Fish of different sizes and colors swim in ponds and lakes. They can breathe in water.




