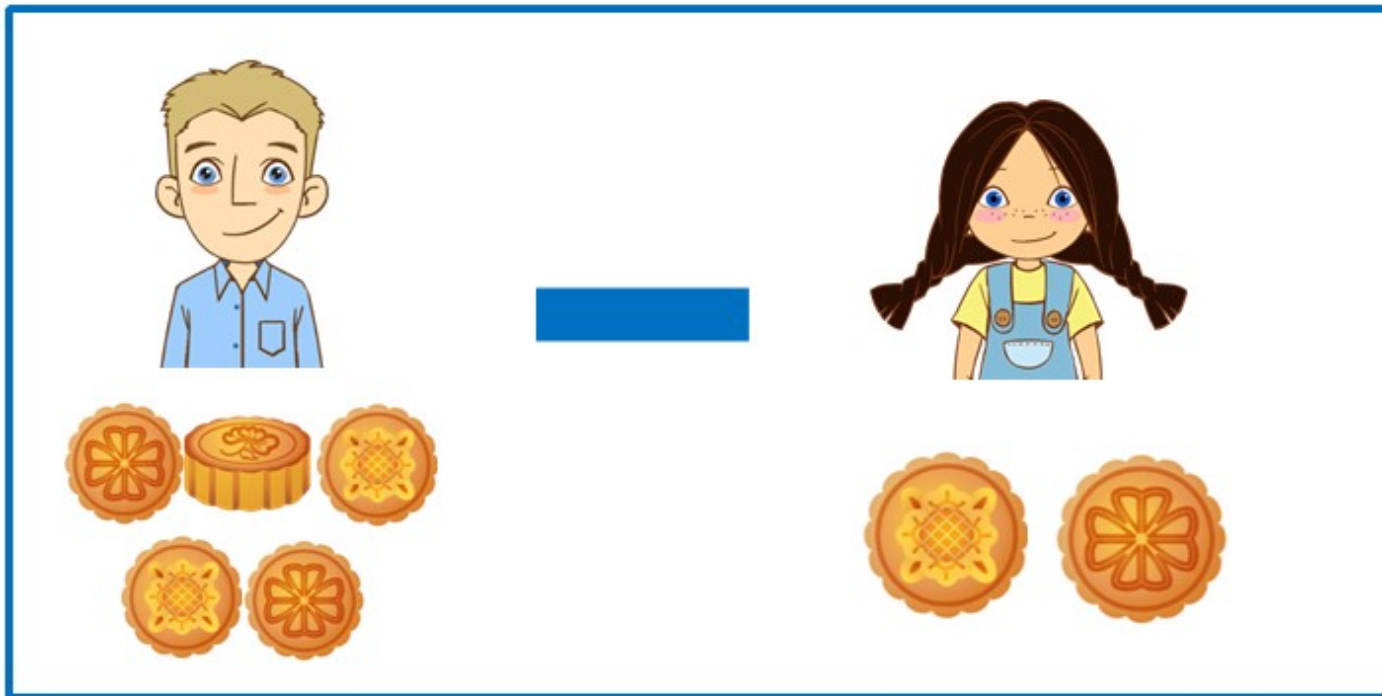
Word Problem
