


## What's a Predator?


Great white sharks swim in the sea.

They are very different. But they all eat meat.








### Shark Attack!

Then the one behind it takes its place. A shark may use 20,000 teeth in its life.




Shh! A cheetah slinks through the grass. It creeps closer and closer to a gazelle (guh-ZELL).


The cheetah leaps. The chase is on!

Thud! The predator knocks the gazelle to the ground and bites its neck.


Time to eat.








They have to slow down after about 20 seconds.






### The Need for Speed

A parrot snake flicks its tongue. In. Out. In. Out.





Finally, it picks up a scent. Tree frog!


The snake winds through the trees.

THIN BODY: Doesn't get stuck on branches

The parrot snake lives in Central America and South America. It makes its home in forests. Its body is perfect for hunting in trees.

**TONGUE:** Smells the air for prey

TEETH: Grab prey



**SCUTES:** Grip tree bark so the snake won't fall

A parrot snake has 36 small teeth. They can grab prey. But they can't chew.

Most snakes hunt like a parrot


snake. But some snakes

The Great Lakes bush viper has huge fangs, but its venom isn't strong enough to kill a person.





The king cobra is the biggest snake with venom. It usually eats other snakes.




PREDATOR: An animal that hunts other animals for food
