



What Isa Sea Otter?

Sea otters are mammals.

They live in the cold Pacific

(puh-SIF-ik) Ocean.





Sometimes sea otters live in zoos or aquariums. They might have been hurt or sick in the wild. Otters get help there.

Otters are fun to watch. They like to play with each other. They dive and splash.

Life in the Sea

Sea otters live close to shore.
They find small animals to
eat there.

Sea otters dive to the ocean floor. They swim through kelp forests. They need lots of food and clean water to live.

KELP: A kind of large seaweed that has a long stalk. It can grow into underwater forests.






Sea otters eat small animals.

They eat more than 40 different kinds. They munch on clams, crabs, squid, urchins, and other animals.








But they don't use a knife and fork! Sea otters use rocks to crack open hard shells.







Do you like to stay clean? Sea otters do.

They groom themselves for hours every day. They scrub their faces and bodies with their paws.

They also somersault (SUM-ur-salt), twist, and turn. This washes food scraps off their bodies. Their fur must stay clean

to be warm.

It's hard to stay warm in cold water. But a sea otter's fur is up to the job. It is thicker than any other animal's fur.

The fur has two layers. The outside layer keeps the cold water out.

The inside layer stays warm and dry.

Sometimes sea otters hold hands (well, paws)!



Sea otters can hold their breath for about five minutes. Most people can't do this for more than one minute.

Baby sea otters are born in the water. They are called pups.

Pups are about two feet long at birth. That's about as long as two cereal boxes.

A mother otter often floats with her pup on her chest.

The mother teaches her pup how to swim, dive, and roll. But she does the hunting until the pup is older.





A mother may wrap her pup in kelp when she dives. Then the pup will stay in one place while she is away.

Sea otters live in groups called rafts. The groups are usually all boys or all girls. They spend lots of time together. They rest, groom, and eat.

Otters in rafts often wrap themselves in kelp, too. They may sleep like this, side by side.

Watching Out for Otters

Scientists are busy studying sea otters. They want to know how otters live and eat. They want to learn about otters that have gotten sick or hurt, too. Then they can help.

Scientists do know that pollution (pol-LOO-shun) hurts sea otters.

Keeping pollution out of the ocean helps sea otters stay healthy.
