


All penguins live between the Equator and the South Pole. Some live where it's very cold. Some live in warmer places like the coasts of Africa or Australia.

Penguins are perfect for their lives at sea. They have a sleek shape for speed. A layer of blubber keeps them warm.




Stiff flippers act like boat paddles to push and steer.

Big webbed feet for better steering.






Layers of soft feathers trap heat. Stiff, oily feathers on top keep out water.

Life in the ocean is fish-elicious! Penguins eat a lot of fish. They have a hooked bill, or beak, to help them grab their dinner. Barbs on their tongues and in their throats help them to hold on to slippery food.

Would you like a drink of salty water to go with that fish? Penguins are able to clean the salt out of ocean water. They get fresh water to drink and the salt dribbles back into the ocean.






While penguins are slurping down their dinners, they have to be careful not to end up as dinner themselves. Penguins are the favorite food of marine mammals such as leopard seals and killer whales.

Penguins are also in danger on land.
Birds like the skua, the Australian sea
eagle, and the giant petrel eat penguins.
Even cats, snakes, foxes, and rats eat
penguins when they can.






On land, most penguins live in a large colony with thousands or even millions of other penguins. If it's cold, they huddle together. It's so warm inside a huddle that penguins take turns moving to the outside to cool off.



Penguins march together to get to their nesting grounds. Once there they wave, strut, shake, call, nod, dance, and sing to find a mate. Most penguins stay with their mate for many years.



Most penguins lay two eggs at a time, but often only one egg survives. The mother and father take turns keeping the egg warm. When it hatches, the parents keep the chick warm and fed.



After a couple of weeks, hundreds or even thousands of chicks wait together while the parents go back to the sea to find food. As the chicks wait, they are in constant danger from skuas, eagles, and other animals.

Finally, the parents return with food. They have to find their chicks in a huge crowd of baby birds. How do they do it? The baby birds sing special songs to help their parents find them.

In a few months, the whole family returns to the sea.




For the emperor penguins, getting to their nesting grounds is hard work. Their home is Antarctica—the coldest place on Earth.

Emperor penguins nest much farther from the ocean than other penguins. They must march for days and nights through snow and wind.

After laying her egg, the female gives it to the male. He will keep it warm


in a flap under his belly.

Unlike other penguins, the male emperor cares for the egg by himself while the female goes back to the ocean to find food.

By December, the whole family is ready to go.




SLEDDING: Penguins speed down icy hills on their feet and bellies to get somewhere fast.
