Edward makes a funny face.



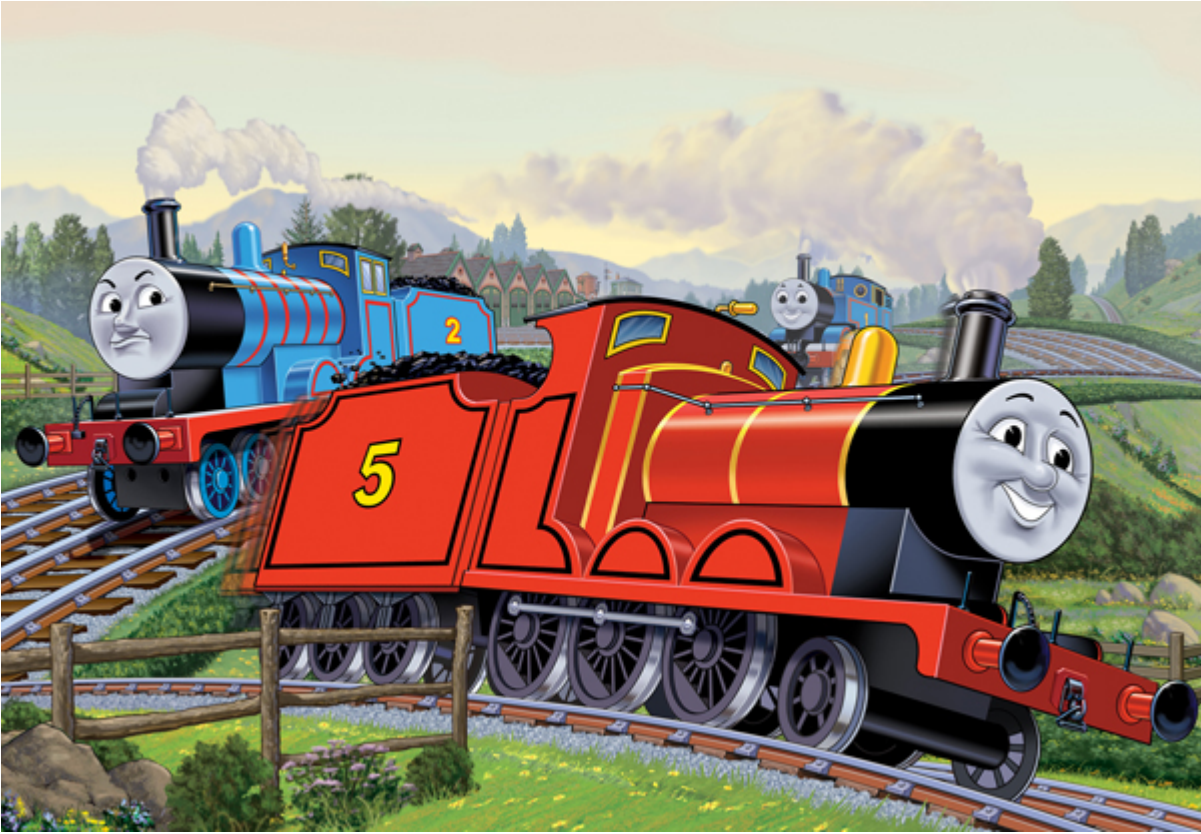
James sets off.

Edward chugs on down the track.





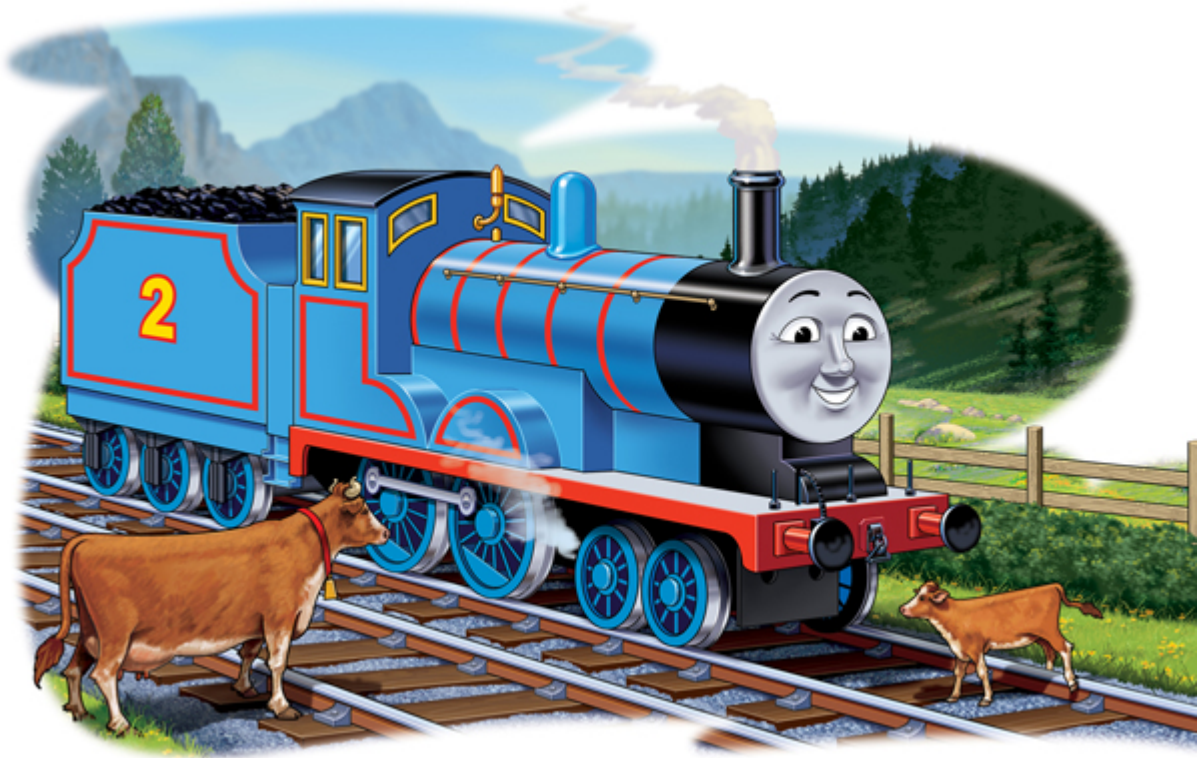
Look! A cow! James races past.

Edward stops to get it back.



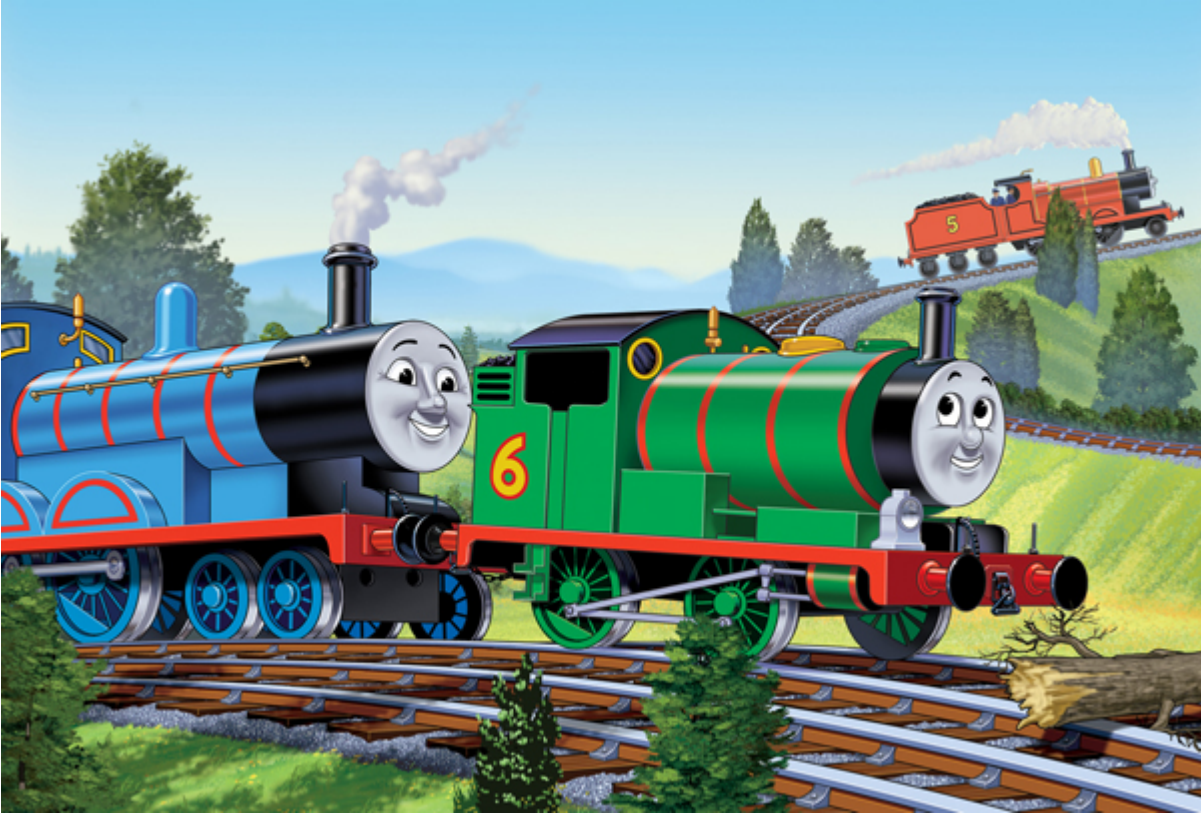
James races. Clickety-clack.  
Edward chugs on down the track.



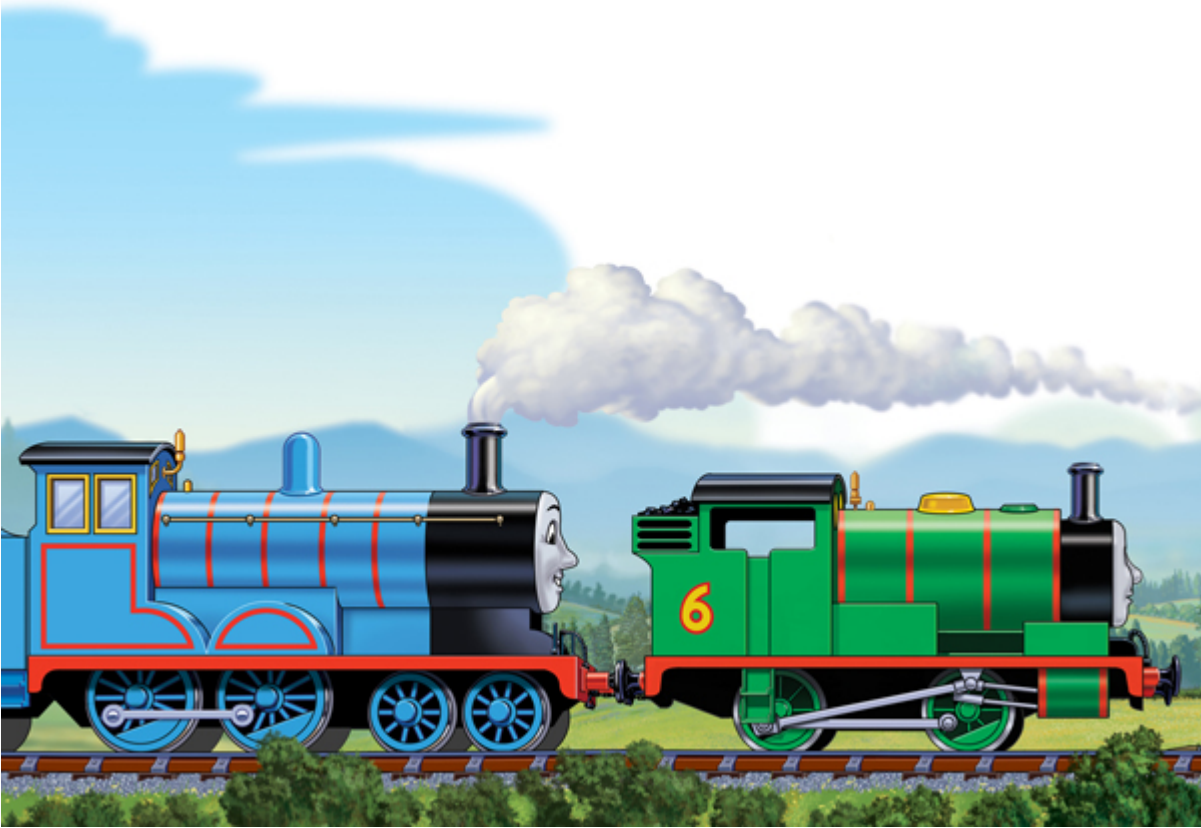
Look! It's Percy!

Edward slows and then he stops.

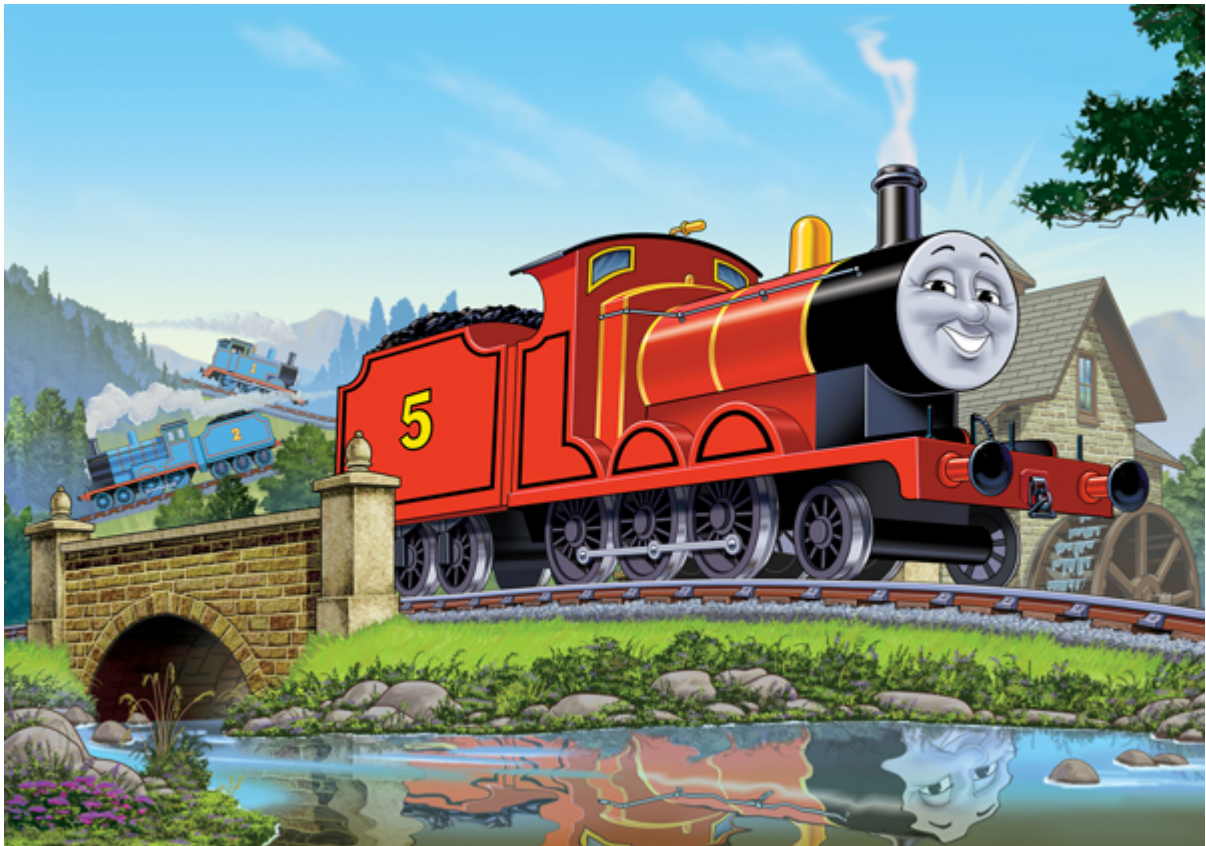




He takes some shoppers  
to the shops.



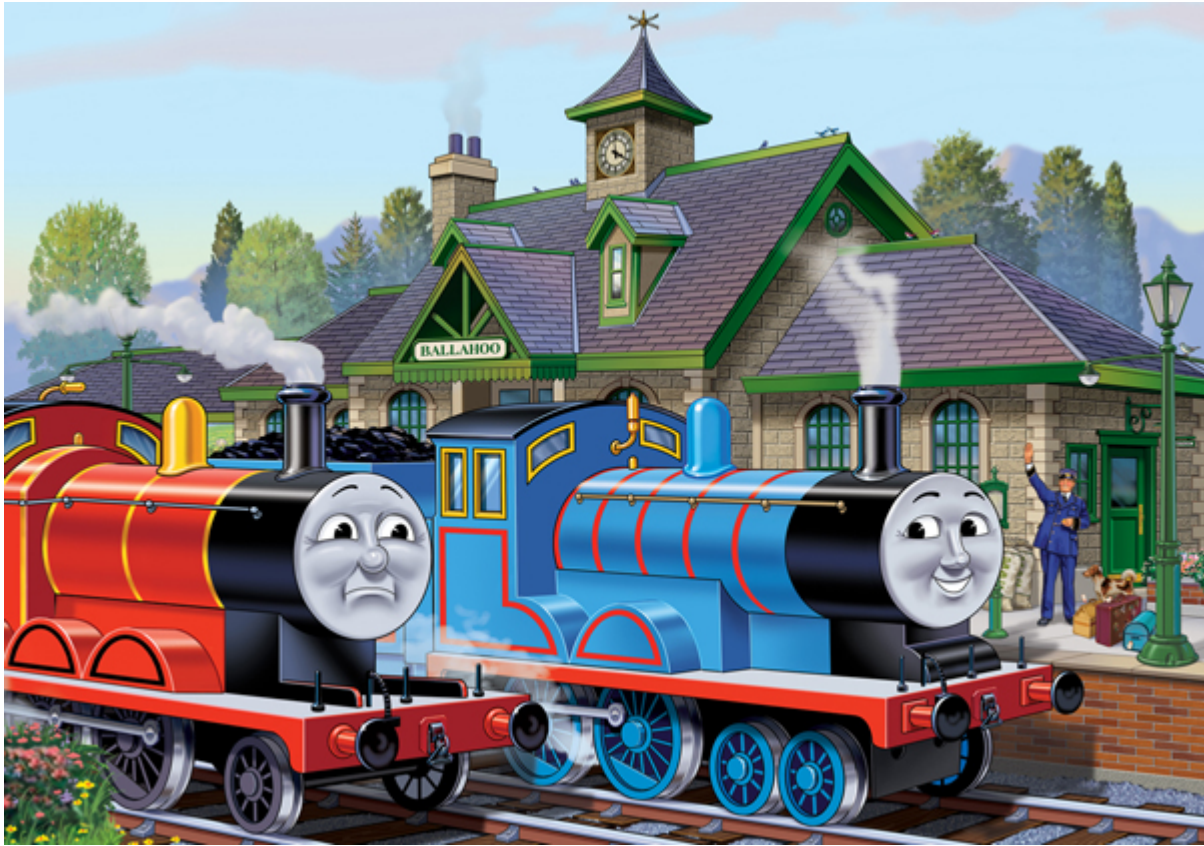
James thinks he is the best.
